The changes in/with the building are complete. Everything went very well. Positive opinions have been offered. The Shooting Stars covered the nearly \$2,000.00 that the work cost.


As you note the demand for van rides is on the rise. During Feb. we started to text for pick ups and find that to be very efficient. We'll see how it goes in the future.

Lisbon has been invited to join a regional transportation program for medical appointments. These grant dollars are available to all 169 towns and I am certain Lisbon will qualify. This regional program is managed by ECTC with a minimal monthly time commitment by our staff. The biggest time commitment is the grant application.

There is also a transportation service that provides subsidized rides for qualified individuals. This program offers affordable and accessible rides when existing services are not able to meet client's transportation needs. This service can be used for rides to work, for healthcare, shopping, etc. Vouchers for this program cost \$25.00 per book of 10. Each book subsidizes \$50 (or \$5 per voucher) worth of meter fare. More details will be in the next Lisbon Link.

I'm investigating Pickleball. Pickleball is a combination of tennis, badminton, ping pong. It is played on a badminton sized court with a net similar to those used for tennis. It can be played on most any surface and enjoyed by all age groups. So far I have an instructor. I have talked to Ellen Joly and Sally Keating at the school about space and equipment. 




### Introduction to Pickleball

Pickleball is a sport described as "a combination of ping-pong, tennis, and badminton", played in schools, parks and recreation centers, correctional facilities, camps, and retirement communities mostly in North America. It uses a simplified combination of tennis rules and strategies.

### History of Pickleball

Pickleball was created during the summer of 1965 on Bainbridge Island - a short ferry ride from Seattle, WA. The original purpose of the game was to provide a sport for the entire family, according to co-inventors U.S. Congressman Joel Pritchard, William Bell, and Barney McCallum.

Pickles was the family dog that would chase after the errant balls and then hide in the bushes, thus Pickle's ball which was later shortened to the namesake of Pickleball. Initially, families played Pickleball in their backyards on a hard surface, on driveways, and on residential dead-end streets. Since the mid-1970's, Pickleball has grown and expanded from a family activity game to a paddle court sport with formalized rules. Now, over 20 years later, Pickleball is played in thousands of school P.E. programs, parks and recreation centers, correctional facilities, camps, YMCAs and retirement communities. This sport is becoming very popular among active senior adults at community centers and is grown.


## The Pickleball Ball

### The Paddle

The paddle is similar to a ping pong paddle in that it is solid and easily maneuverable with a turn of the wrist. When game was invented, wooden paddles were used and are still used at many institutions due to lower cost. ### The Court


The game itself is played on a court that is the same size as a badminton court (20 feet wide by 44 feet long). The net is set at 36 inches high on the adaes and 34 inches in the middle


Pickleball's small court allows younger players or those with varying degrees of mobility to participate in a way that the larger court of tennis sometimes prohibits. Additionally, a rule prohibiting volleying (hitting the ball in the air) in the non-volley zone (the space 7 feet from the net) helps to equalize play and reduce overpowering smashes at the net.

Pickleball has become a common high school sport in gym classes and has gained popularity with teenagers as well as seniors. Schools often host tournaments. In New York State alone, it is estimated that over 500 schools include Pickleball in their curricula.

# Webster University's Pickleball Terms

Dillball- a ball succeeding contact with the court (hitting the ground once) and currently live

Flabjack- a midair pickleball that must bounce on the playing surface (return of serve, or returning the return)ards & chalk

Champion Shot- a ball which double bounces in the No Volley Zone

V0ll3y Llama- a player attacking a ball in the No Volley Zone, illegal in gameplan

DangerZone- nickname of the No Volley Zone

Falafel- aka dead paddle, when a ball is hit with little to no force causing the shot to be extremely short.


Pickledome- the court on which the Championship Game is played on

# Basics

When playing Pickle-ball the serve must be hit underhand and each team must play their first shot off the bounce. After the ball has bounced once on each side then both teams can either volley the ball in the air or play it off the bounce. This eliminates the serve and volley advantage and prolongs the rallies. To volley a ball means to hit it in the air without first letting it bounce.

No volleying is permitted within the seven foot non-volley zone, preventing players from executing smashes from a position within the seven foot zone on both sides of the net. This promotes the drop volley or "dink" shot playing strategies, as Pickle-ball is a game of shot placement and patience, not brute

power or strength.

Both players on the serving team are allowed to serve, and a team shall score points only when serving. A game is played to eleven points and a team must win by two points. Points are lost by hitting the ball out of bounds, hitting the net, stepping into the non-volley zone and volleying the ball, or by volleying the ball before the ball has bounced once on each side of the net. Player positioning on the court for both singles and doubles and playing strategies are found in the rules and DVD that are included in your # 103 Portable Tournament Set.

# **Specifics**

### The Serve:

Players must keep one foot behind the back line when serving. The serve is made underhand. The paddle must pass below the waist. The serve is made diagonally cross court and must clear the non-volley zone. Only one serve attempt is allowed, except in the event of a let (the ball touches the net on the serve, and lands on the proper service court). Then, the serve may be taken over. At the start of each new game, the 1st serving team is allowed only one fault before giving up the ball to the opponents. Thereafter both members of each team will serve and fault before the ball is turned over to the opposing team. When the receiving team wins the serve, the player in the right hand court will always start play.

## The Volley:

To volley a ball means to hit it in the air without first letting it bounce. All volleying must be done with the player's feet behind the non-volley zone line.

## Double Bounce Rule:

Each team must play their first shot off the bounce. That is, the first receiving team must let the served ball bounce, and the serving team must let the return of serve bounce before playing it.

After the two bounces have occurred, the ball can be either volleyed or played off the bounce.

### Faults:

- Hitting the ball out of bounds
- Not clearing the net
- Stepping into the non-volley zone and volleying the ball

# The Court:

The court dimensions are identical to a doubles badminton court. The court dimensions are  $20' \times 44'$  for both doubles and singles. The net is hung 36'' on each end of the net and 34'' in the middle. A non-volley zone extends 7' on each side of the net. There remains 15' on each side of the court. On each side, these  $20' \times 15'$  rectangles are further divided onto two equal rectangles measuring  $10' \times 15'$ . When laying out the court, allow adequate space at each end and sides of the court boundary lines for player movement. (Three to five feet on each end and one to two feet on the sides).




